

We want to share important information that directly affects survivors of domestic and sexual violence in Wayne County and across Michigan.

Like many organizations, <u>First Step</u> relies on funding from the **Victims of Crime Act (VOCA)** to provide critical, lifesaving services. These federal funds are **not taxpayer's dollars** — they come from fines and penalties paid by convicted criminals and make up almost 50% of our annual budget. Nearly 80% of which are our *staff's wages*.

What's Happening with VOCA?

VOCA funding is **dropping nationally by 40%.** This is due to fewer deposits into the federal Crime Victims Fund. **Michigan's state FY2026 budget is still being decided.** As of August 26th, both the House and Senate's proposed budgets leave us a significant shortfall and until it is finalized, we do not know whether **there will be enough resources to offset the federal deficit.**

What VOCA Supports at First Step:

- 24/7 crisis helpline and emergency response
- Shelter and housing support for survivors fleeing abuse
- Advocacy, counseling, and support groups for adults and children
- Legal and systems advocacy to help survivors find safety and justice

Impact on First Step:

Nearly **half of our \$4.5 million** budget comes from VOCA. Cuts of this size put core services — like shelter, counseling, and advocacy — at serious risk. In preparation for these cuts and the unknown, First Step has already suspended critical services like transportation to shelter, medical appointments, and court and hoteling for high-risk clients after an assault.
